## Player Code of Conduct

The NCJGF expects all competitors to adhere to the “Etiquette and Behavior on the Course” section of the USGA Rules of Golf. Entries are subject to rejection at any time, including during an event, by the NCJGF or the host club. The reason for rejection may include unbecoming conduct, did not start (DNS) or no card (NC). Failure to follow the NCJGF Code of Conduct may result in a competitor’s suspension from participation in future NCJGF competitions.

Some examples of Code of Conduct violations include:

- Unsportsmanlike conduct, including abusive language, cheating, club throwing, disrespect to volunteers, officials, fellow competitors and abuse of host facility property.
- Failure to adhere to NCJGF and/or host facility dress codes
- Generally disruptive behavior, acting in anger and creating other distractions

### *Alcohol, Tobacco, & Drugs*

Player use of any of these substances on the golf course or at host facilities will be considered a breach of the Code of Conduct resulting in disqualification and/or suspension of NCJGF membership at the Foundation’s absolute discretion.

### *Dress Code*

The NCJGF defers to the dress code of the host club but also enforces its own code. Unsuitable attire at tournaments, and practice rounds, includes shirts without collars, pants or shorts made of denim, shorts less than 5” above the knee, tank tops, T-shirts and cutoffs. Caps must be worn brim forward. Attire that may be considered offensive,

**distracting to other players, parents, spectators of the host facility are prohibited.**

**A competitor whose dress does not conform to the NCJGF, or host facility, dress code will be asked to change prior to his/her starting time. The penalty for non-compliance is disqualification.**
